How to use this page

- 1 Review the platform description and calculator categories.
- 2 Open Privacy to understand who can and cannot see player information.
- 3 Select Start Free or Sign In to enter the private account area.
- 4 Read the disclosures before entering financial information.

Benefits

- 1 Quickly understand the platform without entering financial data.
- 2 Confirm that player entries are separated from organization licensing.
- 3 Reach the correct sign-in and calculator paths from mobile or desktop.

Important disclosures

- Educational purpose only: NBABudget provides budgeting and planning estimates, not financial, investment, tax, legal, accounting, insurance, benefits, labor, salary-cap, contract, or agent advice.
- CBA and contract review: Results must be checked against the signed Uniform Player Contract, exhibits, the current NBA-NBPA Collective Bargaining Agreement, official league figures, team records, and qualified professionals.
- Tax estimates: Federal, state, local, and jock-tax estimates can differ because of brackets, residency, duty-day sourcing, filing thresholds, reciprocity, credits, deductions, and law changes.
- No affiliation: NBABudget is independent and is not affiliated with, sponsored by, approved by, or endorsed by the NBA, NBPA, NBA G League, any team, or any player.
- Privacy: Individual budget entries are intended to remain private. Organization purchasers should receive aggregate participation information only, not individual financial records.
- Security: A document should not be treated as securely stored until encrypted upload and access controls confirm completion. Never upload credentials, passwords, or unnecessary identity documents.
- No guarantee: Calculations, projections, and educational examples do not guarantee compensation, tax outcomes, investment performance, benefits, eligibility, roster status, or career length.
